# **QUALIFICATIONS & SKILLS:**

The Single Role Medic/EMT is a class found in the Fire District, responsible for responding to emergency and non-emergency medical responses including Basic Life Support (BLS), Advanced Life Support (ALS) and medical transports and performs other related Fire District activities in the community as required.

Typical examples of work include responding to medical emergencies, medical facility patient transfers, motor vehicle collisions, and other requests for medical assistance. Provides emergency medical care at the level authorized in the Linn County Clinical Guidelines, completing pre-hospital care reports, and other forms as required. Maintains vehicles and EMS equipment, maintains education requirements necessary for State of Oregon Paramedic. See Job Description for complete list of minimum and desired qualifications.
